Are you a new or young member or just a member who would like some advice regarding breed points? If so, we have experienced members from within the Society that are willing to spend time with you at the Royal Welsh Show and walk around the sheep lines with you and discuss anything and everything about the breed points. SCHMALLENBERG VIRUS (SPV)

The purpose of this short article is to update the information which is available on SCHMALLENBERG . The virus was first identified in Northern Europe in 2011 in cattle who showed high temperatures, milk drop and gave birth to deformed calves . By 2012 the virus was traced to being spread by biting mosquitos. In the next few years there were few reports, however these increased in 2016 and it now appears that the virus is showing peaks every 3 to 5 years.

In the autumn of 2023 evidence of the presence of the virus was detected in milk samples from cattle. Subsequently, in the last 4 months to March 2024, 442 suspect cases have been tested of which 233 were positive so we can conclude the virus is circulating in the mosquito population and they are busy spreading it to cattle, goats, sheep and even camels. Of the 233 positive cases 24 were in calves, 2 in goats and the rest in lambs.

Infected ewes when in lamb abort or have stillborn lambs. If they are born alive the lambs have limb deformities, curvature of the spine and skull malformation so require euthanasia, surprisingly some ewes with twins will produce one badly deformed lamb and another which appears normal.

It is now thought that the deformities are produced if a ewe is pregnant and is infected by a biting mosquito in the 28 to 60th day of her pregnancy with the same scenario in cattle, but the time span is 80 to 150 days of gestation.

At present there is no vaccine available against this viral infection which has been most serious in the early lambing flocks largely because they tup earlier when the mosquitos are still very active. It does appear that infection can be reduced by either dipping close to tupping or applying insecticides which deter mosquitoes. Research is ongoing and it is very important the information on levels of infection is gathered. To this end APHA offers free testing and can be contacted on 0300 303 8268 in Wales and 03000 200 301 in England. It remains important that as much data as possible is collected as this problem will not go away.
