- The judges may ask to turn the sheep loose during judging. There will be assistance for you to catch them back up if needed
- All sheep must have a society tag before being allowed to enter the ring
- Photos will be taken of all class winners. We are not sure yet when photographs will be – it all depends on what time judging finishes and the weather. It is your responsibility to check with Enfys what the plan is for official photographs
- There will be an opportunity for anyone who hasn't won their class to have a photo if they wish please speak to Enfys

There will be the usual social gathering on Tuesday night at 6.30pm. If it's dry it will be held within the sheep ring, however if it's wet, we will be back at the Society stand which is in its new location. All members are welcome at the gathering whether you have been showing or not. Please bring you own drinks and a chair.
